TEACH AND EQUIP

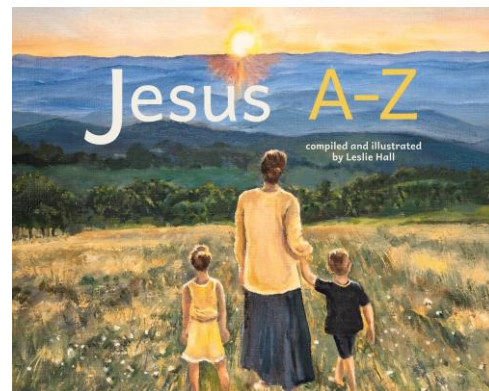
through teacher training resources, educational workshops, and online features like our Education Spotlights, blog articles, and book reviews at ambassadorpublications.org

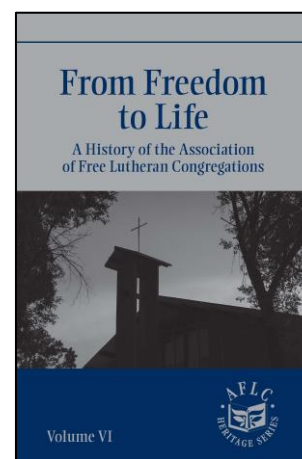
