traveling for a while, they ran short of food. Instead of praying about the problem, they started complaining. But God loved them and listened anyway, and He did an amazing thing. God sent bread to rain down from heaven! The bread from heaven was called manna and tasted like wafers with honey.

In The Lord's Prayer, we ask God to give us this day our daily bread. When we pray for "daily bread," we are not only praying for bread to eat but for everything we need to live each day such as food, clothing, and shelter. God loves His children very much and promises to take good care of us by providing everything we need.

One example of God caring for His children is found in the book of Exodus. God chose a man named Moses to lead God's people, the Israelites, out of the land of Egypt where they had been slaves for many years. This was a very big job since there were about two million people to lead. Moses must have wondered how there would ever be enough food for all those people. But God took wonderful care of them.

Every morning when the Israelites woke up, they found the ground covered with manna. They took their baskets and collected enough to last the whole day. God also sent many quail to them every evening, so they could have meat to eat. And when they got thirsty, God provided water for them. God gave them their daily bread.



The Israelites wandered for forty years through the hot desert. There were no cars or buses then, so they had to do a lot of walking. All that walking should have been very hard on their shoes. But God was good to them! Deuteronomy 29:6 says that God kept their clothes and shoes from wearing out through all those years. God provided for their daily needs.

God cares for us and provides for us too. God gives us our daily bread. In Matthew 6:25, Jesus tells us not to be worried about what we are going to eat or drink or wear. Look at the birds. They don't worry about what they are going to eat. God gives them what they need. And look at the flowers. They don't worry about what they are going to wear. But look how beautiful they are! God takes care of them too. So if God takes such good care of the birds and flowers, we can be sure He will take even better care of us!

God provided for the daily needs of Moses and the Israelites in the wilderness. And God cares for the birds and the flowers. We can be sure He will be faithful to care for us.
