JESUS' RESURRECTION

Many people thought the story of His life was over after Jesus died on the cross and was buried. For those who wanted Jesus to be crucified, there was relief that the One they hated was now dead. For the followers of Jesus, there was great sadness because the One they believed in had been put to death. But the story was not over. Let's look at the facts.

After Jesus' death, a man named Joseph of Arimathea went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus so that it could be properly buried. At that time, it was customary to bury the body the same day the person died.

JEWISH TIME

29 A.D.

A Jewish day is measured from sunset to the next sunset. Science measures a day as 24 hours. In Matthew 12:38-40, Jesus said He would be in the earth three days. These three days are calculated according to the Jewish measurement of time.

- Day 1: Jesus died on Friday, which ended at sunset.
- Day 2: Jesus remained in the earth on the Sabbath, which ended at sunset Saturday.
- Day 3: Jesus rose on Sunday morning, and the women came and found the empty tomb.

Start of Jesus' public ministry

Because Jesus lives, believers do not need to be afraid of dying. Those who trust in Jesus will live in heaven with Him for eternity. That is the glorious and powerful Easter message you can cling to and share with others. The message of our living Savior is for you, your family, your friends, and those whom God allows you to meet each day.

Catechism Corner

- 1. What benefit do we have from the resurrection of Christ? (Q. 189)
 - The resurrection assures us that Christ is the Son of God, and that He has conquered death and made full satisfaction for our sins.
 - The resurrection gives us power to arise from spiritual death and to live a new and holy life.
 - The resurrection assures us that our bodies shall arise in glory on the last day.
- 2. What did Jesus promise the thief on the cross in Luke 23:43?

Because of what Jesus accomplished by His death and resurrection, this promise is true for every believer.

3. It was Paul's desire to "know" on a daily basis "the power of His resurrection" (Philippians 3:10) so that he could "walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:4b) every day. How does the Holy Spirit help us to walk daily in newness of life?

BIBLICAL EVIDENCE FOR THE RESURRECTION

- The empty tomb. The reports of Jesus' resurrection could have been easily refuted if the body of Jesus had remained in the tomb or if His corpse had been found.
- The removed stone. The large stone likely weighing from one to two tons could not have been removed from its position by ordinary human effort.
- The tomb's broken seal. The seal represented the power and authority of Rome. Any person responsible for breaking a Roman seal would face certain execution.
- The Roman guards who fled their post. The penalty for deserting a post was severe, sometimes resulting in execution. The guards would not likely fall asleep or run away considering the consequences.
- The appearances of Jesus in His resurrected body. Christ appeared several times to His disciples and was also seen by a crowd of 500 people. One person may be mistaken, but not that many.

Fast Fact: Tomb



- In Palestine, the common people were buried in shallow graves covered with stones or a stone slab, but people of importance were buried in tombs.
- The entrance to a rock-cut tomb was sealed with a disc-shaped rock that ran in a groove in front of the tomb or with a boulder that fell into the hole beneath it. It was very difficult to move the stone once it was in place.
- The tomb where Jesus was buried was a newly carved cave belonging to a wealthy man, Joseph of Arimathea (Matthew 27:57).
