## THE CONCLUSION

For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

What does the word "Amen" mean?

It means that I should be assured that these petitions are acceptable to our heavenly Father and are heard by Him; for He Himself has commanded us to pray in this manner and has promised to hear us. Amen, Amen, that is, Yes, Yes, it shall be so.

What are the closing words of the Lord's Prayer?

For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

*Of what do these words remind us?* 

We should remember that God is able to answer our prayer, and that the glory belongs to Him alone.

Does God always answer our prayer as we desire?

No; He often answers our prayer by giving us something else and something better than we ask or think.

Does God answer our prayer at once?

Sometimes; but He often delays His answer in order to strengthen our faith and our hope.

In speaking with God, should we only ask for the good things which we like to get? No; we must also return Him thanks for the blessings which we have received.
