Family activity

* Measure 9 feet up on a wall to show how tall Goliath was. Then take turns standing against the wall to compare heights. Emphasize that God uses people of all ages and sizes.

* Go for a walk and look for five smooth stones like David may have used. Talk about how God helped David defeat Goliath the giant.

Did you know?

* Goliath was over 9.5 feet tall. His armor weighed about 125 pounds and his spearhead about 15 pounds (I Samuel 17:4-7).

* David was probably 15-20 years old when he conquered Goliath.

* A good slinger in David's day could hurl a stone as far and as accurate as an archer, up to 440 yards or a quarter of a mile.

What's it all about?

Was young David naive to think he could defeat Goliath? Goliath was a giant, and David was but a youth. How did David have the courage to face Goliath? David trusted God. He was amazed and indignant that someone would come to "taunt the armies of the living God" (I Samuel 17:26). God had helped David kill a lion and a bear to defend his sheep. Now God would help him kill Goliath to defend the people of God. God had promised the Israelites that their enemies would be defeated. David remembered that promise and came with confidence to fight Goliath "in the name of the LORD of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel" (I Samuel 17:45).



David kills the giant

I Samuel 17:1-50

ong ago there lived a boy named David. David took care of his father's sheep. While David watched the sheep out in the pasture, he liked to play his harp and sing songs to God. David loved God and trusted Him. David's brothers were all in King Saul's army. One day David's father called him. "Bring this food to your brothers," he said. David was happy to bring food to his brothers. When he got there, David saw that the enemies of God's people had a very big man fighting on their side. His name was Goliath. Goliath was more than nine feet tall! Everyone was afraid of Goliath. They

Instead, David picked up five smooth stones from the stream and called out to Goliath, "I come to you in the name of God. This battle is the Lord's!"

Goliath laughed to see a boy getting ready to fight him. But David ran quickly towards Goliath. David put a stone into his sling, swung it around, and let it go. The stone hit Goliath in the forehead, and he fell down and died.

David loved God and trusted Him. God helped David win against the enemy.
