Prayer

Did you know?

* The Old Testament foretold what the Messiah's lineage would be (Isaiah II:I), what His name would be and that He would be born of a virgin (Isaiah 7:14), what town He would be born in (Micah 5:2), and that He would suffer and die (Isaiah 53).

Many scholars believe Jesus may have actually been born in the fall or winter of 5 B.C.
The name *Bethlehem* means "house of bread." It was indeed the birthplace for the "Bread of Life."

* Many stables in Bible times were caves in the hillsides.

Family activity

Set up a Nativity scene. Tell the Christmas story as your child helps you put the figures in place.
Make a care package to give to a needy family or elderly person. You can include meat, cheese, fruit, or homemade goodies. Deliver the package as a family and share the Christmas story.

* Donate toys or money to a charity, volunteer at a homeless shelter, or go Christmas caroling at a nursing home.

What's it all about?

The prophecies in the Old Testament clearly laid out the circumstances of Jesus' birth, and God used the events of history to fulfill His divine plan. According to the Old Testament, Jesus was to be born in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2), the City of David. Since Jesus was a descendant of David (Luke 1:27-32), God used the census decreed by Caesar Augustus to bring Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem at the right time for Jesus' birth (Luke 2:1-6). Jesus was probably born in a barn or cave and was laid in a manger. That certainly doesn't seem appropriate for a king! But it was part of God's marvelous plan to send His Son, Jesus, to earth in human form and die on the cross for our sins (Philippians 2:6-8).

After the angels announced the birth of the Savior to the shepherds, "they came in a hurry and found their way to Mary and Joseph, and the baby as He lay in the manger" (Luke 2:16). "The shepherds went back, glorifying and praising God" (Luke 2:20). May our hearts rejoice, too, in the birth of our Savior!
