# Jesus Provides Luke 9:10-17, John 6:1-14

### Prayer

D ear Jesus, thank You for being the one true God. Thank You that You promise to always provide for us. Thank You for our food, our clothes, our home, and our family. Thank You for protecting us when we are asleep and when we are awake. Thank You that You love us. Amen.

## Family activity

Preschoolers love to pretend! Act out the story of feeding the five thousand as a family or with friends. Use fish-shaped crackers for the fish and pieces of bread for the loaves.
Serve bread and fish for a family meal. Talk about how Jesus fed thousands of people with just a few fish and some bread. Ask your children if they would like to eat this meal every day like many people did in Jesus' day.
God can use your family to provide for someone's needs. Maybe you can give someone money, food, gift certificates, or clothing. If you would like to do it anonymously, give it to your pastor and he can deliver it for you.

# Did you know?

\* The loaves Jesus used that day were round biscuit-like barley cakes. The fish were small and either smoked or pickled. This was typical food of the poor in Palestine.

\* At the time of Jesus, people usually ate two meals a day. Breakfast was a light meal in the morning, and supper was a heavier meal in the evening when it was cooler.

\* Jesus thanked God for the food before He gave it to the people (Luke 9:16, John 6:11). Today many people bow in prayer to thank God before each meal.

# What's it all about?

"Where are we to buy bread?" Philip asked Jesus. Philip said that even eight months' wages wouldn't buy enough food to feed the five thousand men, plus women and children, who had gathered to hear Jesus speak. Some disciples said to send the crowd away and let them find their own food. Andrew said a young boy had five loaves and two fish, but that wasn't enough.

But Jesus had a plan. He took the resources they had and multiplied the loaves and fish so there was enough to feed the entire crowd, with twelve baskets left over! Jesus showed that He loved the people and that He was powerful enough to provide for them. Jesus will provide for you too. Philippians 4:19 says, "And my God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus." Tell Jesus about your needs. He will care for you.
