THE HOLY SPIRIT COMES

If you heard the same story from five eyewitnesses, would that be enough evidence to convince you that the story was true? How about 15 witnesses, or 50, or even 500? More than 500 people were eyewitnesses of Jesus' resurrection. That is convincing evidence that Jesus truly did rise from the dead!

The four Gospels are eyewitness accounts recording the "good news" of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. Acts is the New Testament book that follows the Gospels. Beginning with Jesus' ascension, it tells the story of many eyewitnesses as they proclaimed the good news.

After Jesus was gone from their presence, the apostles returned to Jerusalem and remained there together in prayer with other followers of Jesus

THE DAY OF PENTECOST

What Jesus had promised in Acts 1:8 was fulfilled on the day of Pentecost when His followers received the gift of the Holy Spirit in Jerusalem.

Fast Fact: Pentecost



- In the Greek language, "Pentecost" means "fiftieth day."
- Fifty days after Passover, the Jews traveled to Jerusalem to give thanks to God for the harvest (Leviticus 23:15-23). In the Old Testament, this festival was called the Feast of Weeks and came to be known as "Pentecost."
- In the New Testament, God sent His Holy Spirit during the time the Jews were in Jerusalem celebrating Pentecost (Acts 2:1-5).
- Today Christians celebrate the giving of the Holy Spirit (Pentecost) 50 days after Easter.

PERSECUTION AND GROWTH

While gathering for worship in the temple had been and continued to be of great importance to the new believers in Acts 2, that practice would soon change.

These early Christians faced opposition and persecution from unbelievers in the cities where they lived. Sometimes they were tortured for their faith. Because of this, studying the Scriptures and having fellowship together was very important to the early Christians. This gathering

Four common meanings of the word "church" are

- a building: "We are going to the meeting at Our Savior's Lutheran Church."
- a congregation: "Our church gathers for worship each Sunday at 10 A.M."
- a denomination: "The Lutheran Church teaches salvation by grace through faith."
- the universal body of believers: "All who trust in Christ as Savior are part of the Christian Church."

together helped to strengthen their faith and encouraged them when facing persecution.

In spite of the persecution, believers continued to worship in the temple, and Peter and John continued to preach. But then the persecution of Christians increased. Peter and John were arrested in Acts 4, Stephen was stoned in Acts 7, and Saul began to persecute the Christians for their belief in Jesus in Acts 8. As a result, Christian congregations also began to worship in private homes and other places.

"And every day, in the temple and from house to house, they kept right on teaching and preaching Jesus as the Christ" (Acts 5:42).
