Jesus Christ, the Greatest Prophet

o you remember learning about Moses? God chose Moses to be His **prophet**. A prophet is someone who is sent by God to speak His message. A prophet sometimes speaks words of promise and sometimes speaks words of judgment from God. The message God gave Moses was that He would save His people from the Egyptians and lead them to the promised land. In his message to God's people before he died, Moses said, "The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your countrymen, you shall listen to him."

The Prophet that Moses was talking about is Jesus, the greatest Prophet of all whom God would send. When Jesus came to earth, He brought many messages from God, but the most important message was that He would die and rise again. Jesus, who is the greatest Prophet, is also our High Priest and King. We will study more about Jesus' work as High Priest and King in the next two lessons.

One day, Jesus was in His home town of Nazareth. It was His habit to go to the **synagogue** on the **Sabbath**. The text to be read that day was what Isaiah had written about the great Prophet mentioned by Moses. Jesus stood up, and the book was handed to Him. He read, "The Spirit of the Lord is UPON ME, BECAUSE HE ANOINTED ME TO PREACH THE GOSPEL TO THE POOR. HE HAS SENT ME TO PROCLAIM RELEASE TO THE CAPTIVES, AND RECOVERY OF SIGHT TO THE BLIND, TO SET FREE THOSE WHO ARE OPPRESSED." After He finished reading, Jesus sat

down. Everyone's eyes were on Him. "Today," Jesus said, "this Scripture has been **fulfilled** in your hearing."

The people understood that Jesus was claiming to be the great Prophet. As Jesus continued to speak, they became angry and would not believe what He told them. How could this Man who had grown up among them be the promised One? The people became so filled with **rage** that they drove



Him out of the city and tried to throw Him off a cliff. But Jesus simply walked through the angry **mob** and went on His way. Many people refused to believe that Jesus was the great Prophet God had promised to send. They did not realize He was the promised Savior.

God's Word tells us that we are all sinners and in need of Jesus the Savior. Do you know someone who doesn't want to believe that he or she is a sinner? How do others respond when you talk about Jesus? Does it matter what others think?

What Jesus says is true. Jesus is our great Prophet who tells us that we sin. We

know that what is written about Him in the Scriptures is true, that He died and rose again for you and for all sinners. No other prophet could have done that.

God sent Jesus the Prophet to proclaim good news to the poor. You are poor because you are sinful. You do sin, and you need a Savior. The good news for you is that because Jesus died and rose again, He forgives you, saves you, and gives you victory over sin and death. All of this is yours through faith because of God's goodness to you. Jesus is the greatest Prophet, and He is more than a prophet. He is your Savior.
